This date was chosen in 1969, commemorating two significant events: the founding of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the signing of the first International Telegraph Convention, in 1865; in order to raise awareness in the world community about the use of the Internet and other ICTs, aimed at reducing the digital divide in some societies and economies of the world.
