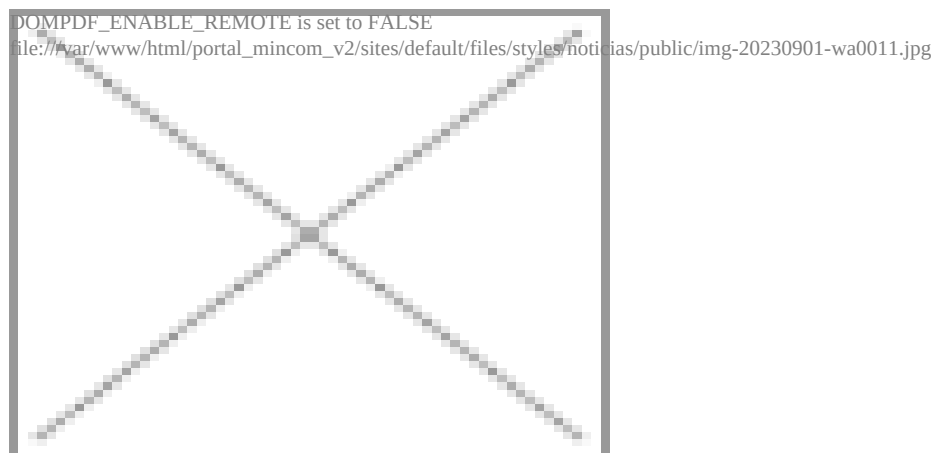

Chaired by the Minister of Communications, Mayra Arevich Marín and First Deputy Minister Wilfredo González Vidal, the training of mayors and colleagues who make up the working groups at the municipal level for the promotion of banking and the use of QR in the capital city began.

Executives and specialists from the Cuban Telecommunications Company (Etecsa) and Xetid provided practical content and clarified doubts.

Enabling the use of these platforms for digital payment, as well as the QR code is very important in this process of bancarization. Among the topics addressed is digital contracting for economic actors through Transfermóvil, as an intuitive and easy-to-use platform for contracting requests.
